Statewide Law Enforcement Radio System (SLERS)



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Statewide Law Enforcement Radio System (SLERS)

- SLERS is a single, unified digital radio network for state law enforcement officers and other participating agencies throughout the state
 - Consists of 219 tower sites
 - Covers over 60,000 square miles (including 25 miles offshore)
 - More than 20,500 radios worn by officers and installed in patrol cars, boats, motorcycles, and aircraft throughout the state



Statewide Law Enforcement Radio System (SLERS)

- SLERS provides state law enforcement personnel with a shared radio system
- Effective interagency, interoperable communications, Mission Critical Push To Talk
- Coordinated communications with local public safety entities
- A viable solution to radio frequency congestion

- **The Joint Task Force on State Agency Law Enforcement Communications (JTF Board)**
 - Established in section 282.709, F.S.
 - Seven-member board comprised of representatives from Statewide Law Enforcement Agencies: DHSMV, FWC, FDLE, DBPR, DFS, DACS and FDC
 - Provides advice to DMS relating to member agency needs
 - FDLE and the Division of Emergency Management consult with DMS to enhance and improve the interoperability of the network
 - In 2014, recognized a need to upgrade the current system to a next-generation P25 Interoperable nonproprietary radio network

- Contract Term: 20 years
- Effective Date: September 28, 2000 through June 30, 2021
- Annual Appropriation: \$18,220,000
- Fees:
 - \$1 annual surcharge on initial and renewal registrations required for motor vehicles and vessels, in accordance with section 320.0802, F.S., and subsection 328.72(9), F.S.
 - \$3 traffic and criminal traffic violation surcharge, in accordance with subsection 318.18(17), F.S.

- Procurement goals:
 - Improved, more effective public safety communications
 - Greater operational resilience
 - Enhanced coverage with highly available and highly reliable land coverage
 - Comprehensive management and monitoring capabilities
 - Greater flexibility to take advantage of evolving technological capabilities

What is FirstNet?

- An independent authority within the U.S. Department of Commerce
- Authorized by Congress under the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012
- Its mission is to develop, build and operate the nationwide, broadband network with priority and preemption for first responders
- AT&T was awarded a 25-year, \$6.5 billion federal contract to build out the dedicated network

FloridaNet Executive Committee

The FloridaNet Executive Committee was created to oversee the efforts involved in assessing Florida's strategy for connecting with FirstNet.

The Committee works to achieve broad participation of the public safety community and its private sector partners in Florida to plan for FirstNet implementation, including design, operation, and governance.

- Required by the FirstNet/National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) grant process
- Serves as a representative governance body to be responsive to the Governor
- Ensures a superior product through broad participation
- Includes participation from the private sector
- Executive meetings held beginning December 2013

Metropolitan Briefings

Metropolitan leadership briefings are provided by FirstNet and AT&T, and have held three events in Florida. The topics cover the goals and solutions offered by FirstNet and AT&T.

Three events held in the Miami-Dade, Orlando and Tampa metropolitan areas.

Stakeholder Workshops

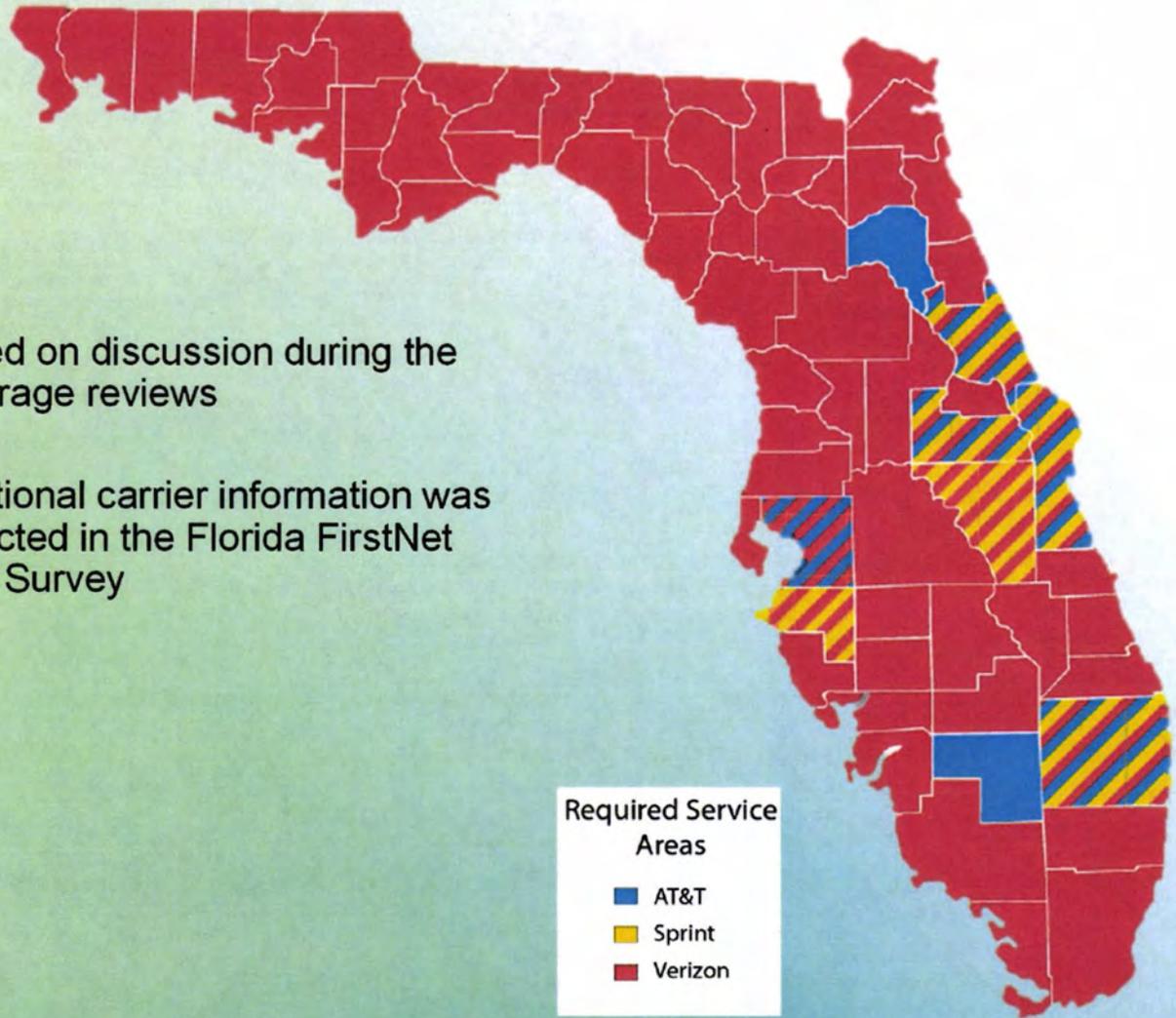
Stakeholder workshops collected user requirements for the National Public Safety Broadband Network. Workshops were hosted by ISF, Inc., on behalf of DMS.

Workshops were held in 21 cities across Florida, with more than 540 participants, including:

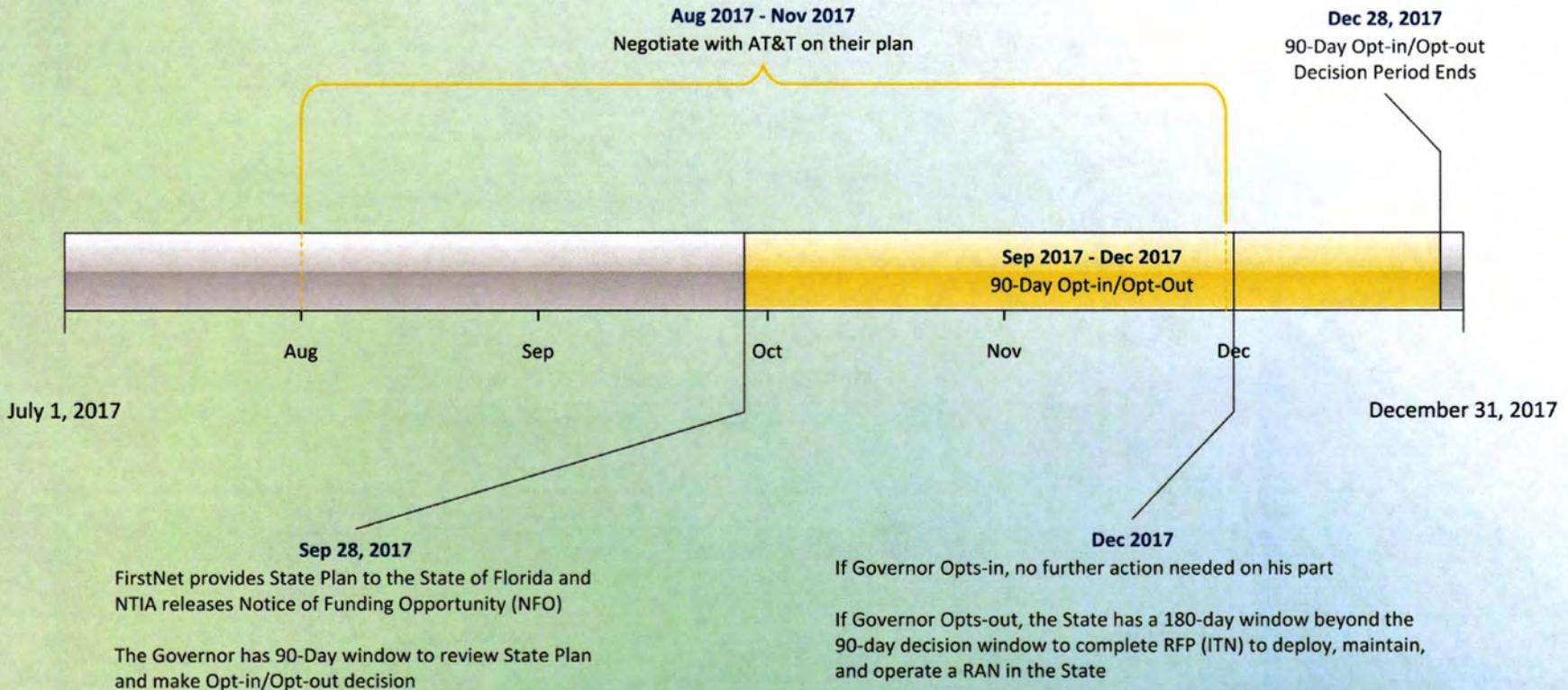

Florida Public Safety Primary Carriers

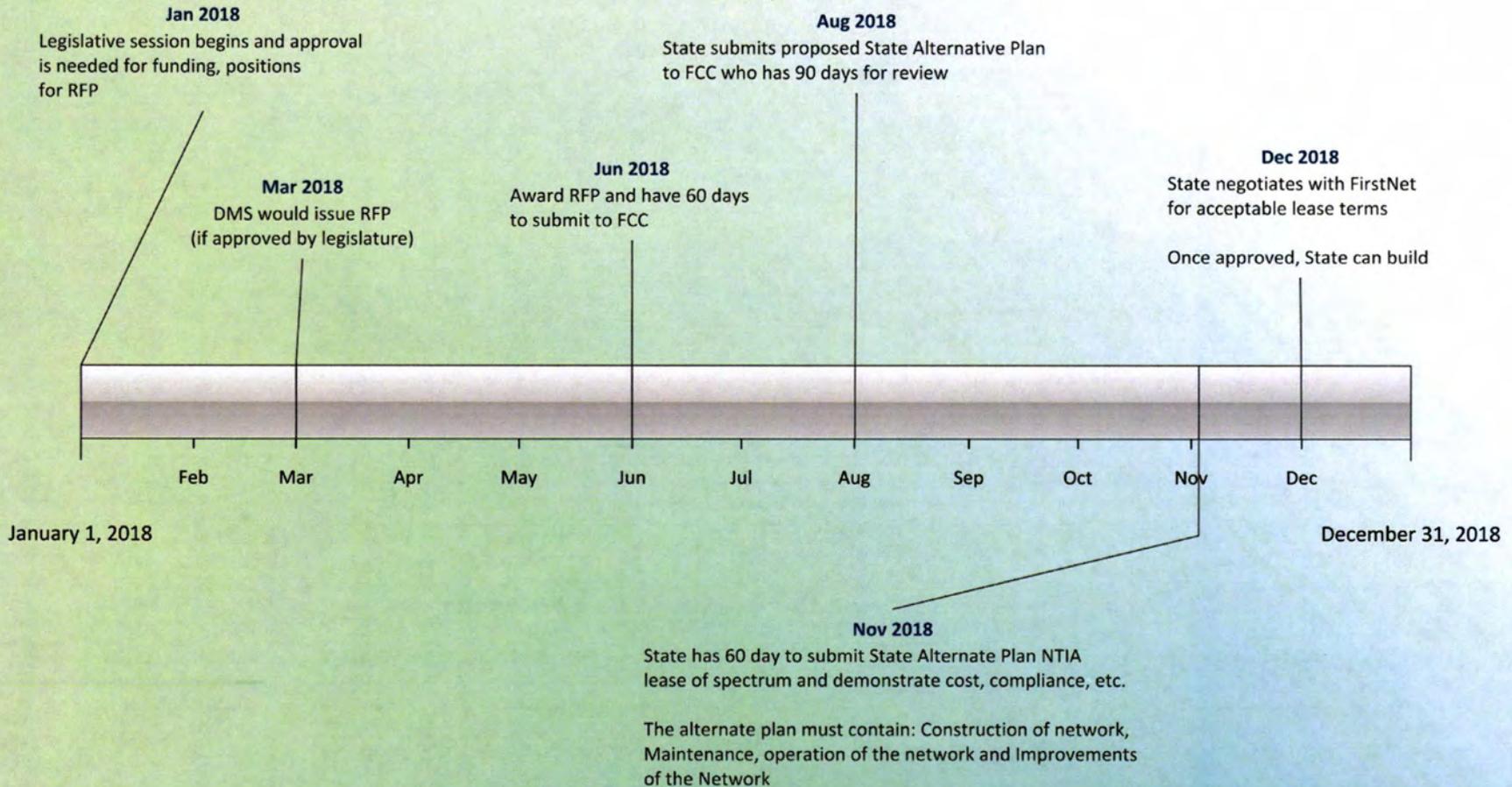
- Based on discussion during the coverage reviews
- Additional carrier information was collected in the Florida FirstNet Web Survey



- Under FirstNet's enabling legislation (47 U.S.C §1442(e)(2)), the Governor must choose whether to participate in deployment of the network as proposed in the FirstNet State Plan (**Opt-In**) or initiate the process to assume responsibility for deploying, maintaining, operating, and improving a Radio Access Network in Florida that interoperates with the FirstNet network (**Opt-Out**).
- With an Opt-In election, FirstNet and AT&T will assume all responsibility and costs for deploying, operating, maintaining, and improving the FirstNet network in Florida. Florida will incur no risk, responsibility, or cost for deploying the FirstNet network. Further, an Opt-In election does not commit Florida's public safety agencies to subscribe to the FirstNet network or buy devices.
- With an Opt-Out election, Florida assumes all responsibility and costs associated with deploying, operating, maintaining, and improving a FirstNet compatible Radio Access Network in Florida.

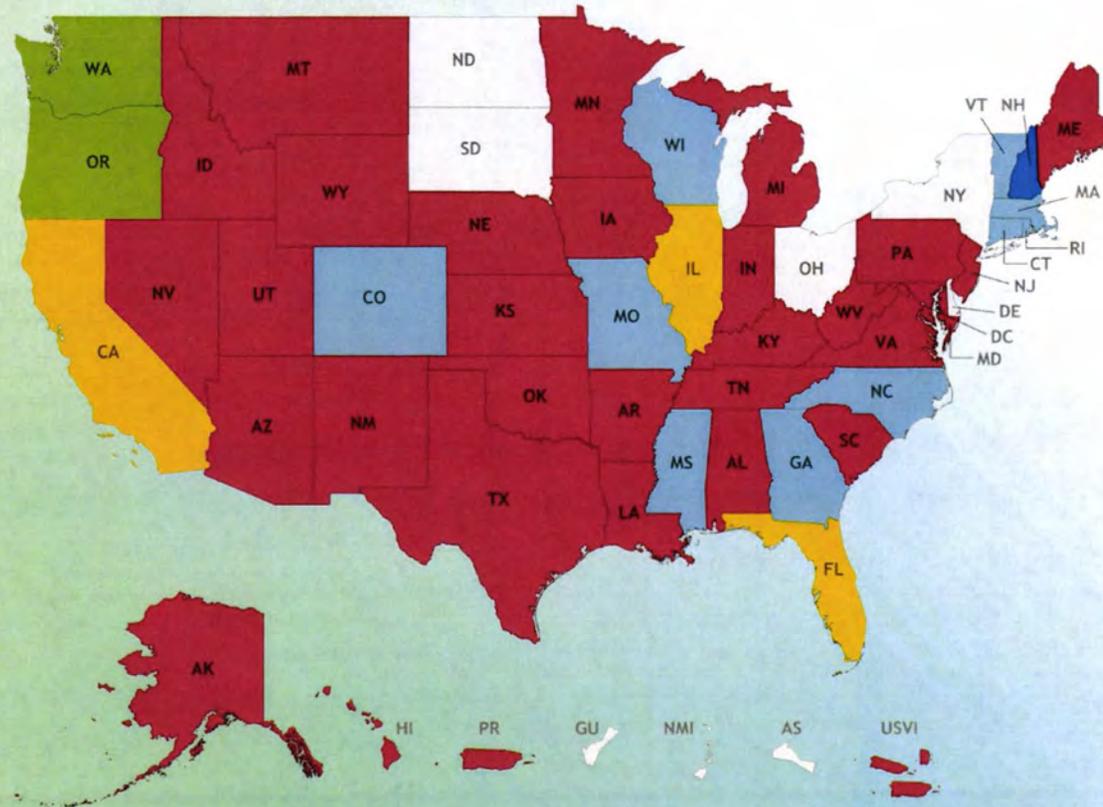


2018 Timeline
