 65 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section  
 66 320.06, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

67 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and  
 68 validation stickers generally.—

69 (3) (a) Registration license plates must be made of metal  
 70 specially treated with a retroreflection material, as specified  
 71 by the department. The registration license plate is designed to  
 72 increase nighttime visibility and legibility and must be at  
 73 least 6 inches wide and not less than 12 inches in length,  
 74 unless a plate with reduced dimensions is deemed necessary by  
 75 the department to accommodate motorcycles, mopeds, or similar

76 smaller vehicles. Validation stickers must also be treated with  
77 a retroreflection material, must be of such size as specified by  
78 the department, and must adhere to the license plate. The  
79 registration license plate must be imprinted with a combination  
80 of bold letters and numerals or numerals, not to exceed seven  
81 digits, to identify the registration license plate number. The  
82 license plate must be imprinted with the word "Florida" at the  
83 top and the name of the county in which it is sold, the state  
84 motto, or the words "Sunshine State" at the bottom. Apportioned  
85 license plates must have the word "Apportioned" at the bottom  
86 and license plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.  
87 320.08(3)(d), (4)(m) or (n), (5)(b) or (c), or (14) must have  
88 the word "Restricted" at the bottom. License plates issued for  
89 vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with the  
90 word "Florida" at the top and the word "Dealer" at the bottom  
91 unless the license plate is a specialty license plate as  
92 authorized in s. 320.08056. Manufacturer license plates issued  
93 for vehicles taxed under s. 320.08(12) must be imprinted with  
94 the word "Florida" at the top and the word "Manufacturer" at the  
95 bottom. License plates issued for vehicles taxed under s.  
96 320.08(5)(d) or (e) must be imprinted with the word "Wrecker" at  
97 the bottom. Any county may, upon majority vote of the county  
98 commission, elect to have the county name removed from the  
99 license plates sold in that county. The state motto or the words  
100 "Sunshine State" shall be printed in lieu thereof. A license

101 | plate issued for a vehicle taxed under s. 320.08(6) may not be  
 102 | assigned a registration license number, or be issued with any  
 103 | other distinctive character or designation, that distinguishes  
 104 | the motor vehicle as a for-hire motor vehicle.

 110 | shall have the word "Fleet" appearing at the bottom and the word

 113 | plates shall conform in all respects to the provisions of this  
 114 | chapter, except as specified herein. For additional fees as set  
 115 | forth in s. 320.08056, fleet companies may purchase specialty

 138 plate, including all annual use fees, processing fees, fees  
 139 associated with switching license plate types, and any other  
 140 applicable fees.

141 Section 4. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended  
 142 to read:

143 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to  
 144 ~~establish~~ specialty license plates.—

145 (1) If a specialty license plate requested by an  
 146 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit  
 147 the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the  
 148 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as  
 149 practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving  
 150 the specialty license plate becomes a law.

151 (2) (a) Within 120 days after ~~following~~ the specialty  
 152 license plate becomes ~~becoming~~ law, the department shall  
 153 establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to  
 154 allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The  
 155 processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge  
 156 and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use  
 157 fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the  
 158 voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time  
 159 of issuance of the license plates.

160 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license  
 161 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license  
 162 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of  
 163 3,000 ~~1,000~~ voucher sales, or in the case of an out-of-state  
 164 college or university license plate, 4,000 voucher sales, before  
 165 manufacture of the license plate may commence. If, at the  
 166 conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the minimum sales  
 167 requirement has ~~requirements have~~ not been met, the specialty  
 168 plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue  
 169 development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale  
 170 vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser  
 171 of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee  
 172 collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate  
 173 or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.

174 (3) (a) New specialty license plates that have been  
 175 approved by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (b)

176 shall be issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08056(4)  
 177 provided that they have met the presale requirement. All other  
 178 provisions of this section must also be met before a specialty  
 179 license plate may be issued. If the next awaiting specialty  
 180 license plate has not met the presale requirement, the  
 181 department shall proceed in the order provided in s.  
 182 320.08056(4) to identify the next qualified specialty license  
 183 plate that has met the presale requirement. The department shall  
 184 cycle through the list in statutory order.

185 (b) If the Legislature has approved 125 or more specialty  
 186 license plates, the department may not make any new specialty  
 187 license plates available for design or issuance until a  
 188 sufficient number of plates are discontinued pursuant to s.  
 189 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being issued does  
 190 not exceed 125. Notwithstanding s. 320.08056(8) (a), the 125-  
 191 license-plate limit includes license plates above the minimum  
 192 sales threshold and those exempt from that threshold.

 313 plate that has been discontinued by the department may keep the

 317 exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate annual  
 318 use fee under subsection (4) for the remainder of the 10-year  
 319 license plate replacement period.

320 (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty  
 321 license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the  
 322 department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date  
 323 the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the  
 324 department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the  
 325 applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs

326 associated with discontinuance of the plate. All remaining

358 (11) The annual use fee from the sale of specialty license  
 359 plates, the interest earned from those fees, or any fees  
 360 received by any entity ~~an agency~~ as a result of the sale of  
 361 specialty license plates may not be used for the purpose of  
 362 marketing to, or lobbying, entertaining, or rewarding, an  
 363 employee of a governmental agency that is responsible for the  
 364 sale and distribution of specialty license plates, or an elected  
 365 member or employee of the Legislature.

366 (12) For out-of-state college or university license plates  
 367 created pursuant to this section, the recipient organization  
 368 shall:

369 (a) Have established an endowment, based in this state,  
 370 for the purpose of providing scholarships to Florida residents  
 371 meeting the statutory requirements for that license plate.

372 (b) Provide documentation acceptable to the department  
 373 that the organization and the department have the college's or

 384 ~~1,000 plates~~ for at least 12 consecutive months. A warning  
 385 letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization following  
 386 the first month in which the total number of valid specialty  
 387 plate registrations is below 3,000, or in the case of an out-of-
