By the Education Committee; Representative Sullivan—

**HB 7103**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 1004.04, F.S.; revising student requirements for entrance into certain teacher preparation programs; deleting authorization for a teacher preparation program to waive such requirements for certain students; amending s. 1012.585, F.S.; providing limitations for inservice points a teacher may earn for certain mandatory training topics; amending s. 1012.98, F.S.; requiring district school boards to calculate an amount of specified funds for use by teachers for professional development; requiring the Department of Education to identify specified professional development opportunities; amending s. 1013.44, F.S.; prohibiting costs associated with certain solar energy systems from being included in certain cost per student station limitations; requiring the Commissioner of Education to submit a report to specified entities by December 1, 2020, on the feasibility of implementing a certain program; providing effective dates.

**CS/CS/CS/HB 203**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to growth management; amending s. 57.112, F.S.; deleting a provision that prohibits specified attorney fees and costs from applying to local ordinances adopted pursuant to the growth policy act; amending s. 163.3167, F.S.; specifying requirements for certain comprehensive plans effective after a specified date and for associated land development regulations; amending s. 163.3168, F.S.; requiring the Department of Economic Opportunity to give a preference to

certain counties and municipalities when selecting applications for funding for technical assistance; amending s. 163.3177, F.S.; requiring the comprehensive plan to include a property rights element; providing a statement of rights that a local government may use; requiring local government to adopt a property rights element by a specified date; providing that a local government's property rights element may not conflict with the statutorily provided statement of rights; amending s. 163.3237, F.S.; providing that certain property owners are not required to consent to development agreement changes under certain circumstances; amending s. 171.042, F.S.; prohibiting a municipality from annexing specified areas under certain circumstances; amending s. 180.02, F.S.; providing conditions under which a municipality may exercise certain powers to provide water and sewer services within the unincorporated area of a county; amending s. 337.401, F.S.; providing a timeframe for processing permit applications for use by right-of-way by utilities; amending s. 380.06, F.S.; authorizing certain developments of regional impact agreements to be amended under certain circumstances; providing a declaration of important state interest; providing an effective date.

**CS/HB 293**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to certain defendants with mental illness; amending s. 394.658, F.S.; exempting certain fiscally constrained counties from local match requirements for specified grants; creating s. 916.1095, F.S.; creating the Law Enforcement Behavioral Health Intervention Unit Pilot Program in certain counties for a specified purpose and number of years; requiring the sheriffs' offices in such counties to establish behavioral health intervention units; requiring the sheriffs to assign deputies to the units; providing training requirements; requiring the units to consult with specified professionals for certain services; providing duties of the units; requiring annual reports; providing reporting requirements; providing an expiration date; creating s. 916.135, F.S.; creating the Misdemeanor Mental Health Diversion Pilot Program by a specified date in certain counties for a specified purpose and number of years; providing applicability; providing definitions; outlining a process for the pilot program; requiring the speedy trial period to be immediately tolled when a defendant is involuntarily committed; requiring the court to order a defendant to comply with certain mental health conditions of pretrial release; requiring the state attorney to consider dismissal of charges upon a defendant's successful completion of mental health treatment; requiring the court to consider specified information before a defendant is returned to jail; requiring annual reports; providing reporting requirements; providing an expiration date; providing an effective date.

**CS/CS/HB 537**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to home-based businesses; creating s. 559.955, F.S.; specifying conditions under which a business is considered a home-based business; authorizing a home-based business to operate in a residential zone under certain circumstances; prohibiting a local government from certain actions relating to the licensure and regulation of home-based businesses; authorizing specified business owners to challenge certain local government actions; authorizing the prevailing party to recover specified attorney fees and costs; providing an effective date.

**CS/CS/HB 569**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to diesel exhaust fluid; creating s. 330.401, F.S.; requiring the governing body of each public airport that meets certain criteria to create a diesel exhaust fluid safety mitigation and exclusion plan for submission to the Department of Transportation; providing plan requirements; requiring an annual certification of compliance; providing an effective date.

By the Commerce Committee; and Insurance & Banking Subcommittee; Representatives Fischer and D. Smith—

**CS/CS/HB 723**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to peer-to-peer car sharing; creating s. 627.7483, F.S.; providing definitions; providing motor vehicle insurance requirements for peer-to-peer car sharing; providing that peer-to-peer car-sharing programs have an insurable interest in shared vehicles in specified periods; authorizing peer-to-peer car-sharing programs to own and maintain certain policies of motor vehicle insurance; providing liabilities under certain circumstances; providing applicability; requiring shared vehicle owners' insurers to indemnify peer-to-peer car-sharing programs under certain circumstances; providing exemptions from vicarious liabilities; authorizing motor vehicle insurance policies to exclude specified coverages under certain circumstances; authorizing specified insurers to seek contributions against indemnifications under certain circumstances; providing requirements for notifications of implications of liens; providing requirements for recordkeeping; requiring specified disclosures to shared vehicle drivers and owners; requiring driver license verification and data retention under certain circumstances; providing responsibilities and indemnifications for specified equipment; providing requirements for verification and notification relating to motor vehicle safety recalls; providing construction; providing an effective date.

**CS/CS/HB 787**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to driver licenses and identification cards; amending s. 322.08, F.S.; requiring application forms for original, renewal, and replacement driver licenses and identification cards to include language allowing a voluntary contribution to the Live Like Bella Childhood Cancer Foundation; amending s. 322.14, F.S.; authorizing a person with specified disabilities to have the capital letter "D" placed on his or her driver license under certain circumstances; providing requirements for the placement of such letter on, or the removal of such letter from, a person's driver license; providing an effective date.

**CS/CS/HB 977**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle dealers; providing legislative findings; amending s. 324.021, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "rental company" to exclude certain motor vehicle dealers, for the purpose of determining minimum insurance coverage requirements; providing that specified motor vehicle dealers and their affiliates are immune to causes of action and not vicariously or directly liable for harm to persons or property under certain circumstances; providing that specified motor vehicle dealers and their affiliates are not adjudged liable in civil proceedings or guilty in criminal proceedings under certain circumstances; providing exceptions; providing an effective date.

**CS/CS/HB 1181**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Disaster Volunteer Leave Act; amending s. 110.120, F.S.; providing and revising definitions; revising conditions under which an employee may be granted a leave of absence under the Florida Disaster Volunteer Leave Act; specifying requirements and limitations for such leave; providing an effective date.

**CS/CS/HB 1249**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transfer of tax exemption for veterans; amending s. 196.011, F.S.; conforming a provision to changes made by the act; amending s. 196.081, F.S.; providing that certain veterans and their surviving spouses receiving a certain homestead tax exemption may apply for and receive a prorated refund of property taxes paid on new homestead property acquired during a certain timeframe; requiring the property appraiser to immediately make certain entries upon the tax rolls to allow a prorated refund under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

F.S., relating to examinations; amending ss. 477.013, 477.0135, 477.0265, 480.034, 480.035, 480.043, 480.046, 480.0465, 480.047, 480.052, 480.0535, 627.6407, 627.6619, 627.736, and 641.31 F.S.; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; making technical changes; providing an effective date.
