

## AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2019, by and between the FAMILY LAW SECTION of THE FLORIDA BAR, ("SECTION") and SMITH, BRYAN AND MYERS, INC. ("LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR"), who, and in consideration as expressed herein, agree as follows: The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR shall serve from July 1, 2019 as a legislative consultant for the SECTION, through and ending June 30, 2020. The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR agrees to comply with all policies adopted by The Florida Bar Board of Governors and by the SECTION. The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR shall provide the following services:

1. To serve as legislative consultant in all those matters which affect the SECTION, as more fully set forth in the SECTION's attached Lobbyist Expectations.
2. The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR agrees that if the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR individually, or the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR's firm are to represent any client before the Florida Legislature (other than set forth on the attached listing), the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR will notify the Executive Director of The Florida Bar, the Chair of The Florida Bar's Legislation Committee, the Chair of the SECTION, and the Chair of the SECTION's Legislation Committee, in writing, at least five (5) days prior to initiation of any such representation by the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR and that any subsequent conflicts will be disclosed immediately.
3. The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR agrees to work on Florida Bar legislative matters when directed by the Executive Director of The Florida Bar when the Executive Director believes that such participation is necessary and in the best interest of the membership of The Florida Bar. In this event, the cost of the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR's time will be assessed against the SECTION unless this use creates a shortage or hardship on the SECTION. In that event, The Florida Bar may reimburse the SECTION for the appropriate amount of the legislative expense.
4. The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR agrees to coordinate all activities regarding the Florida Legislature which might affect the SECTION.
5. For the provision of services as set forth herein, The SECTION will pay the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR a fee of \$9,000 per month, inclusive of all reasonable costs and expenses to be paid in the following manner: \$9,000 per month commencing on July 1, 2019 and continuing, with payment to be made by the last day of each month, through June 30, 2020.

Payments shall be made to SMITH, BRYAN AND MYERS, INC. and remitted to HEATHER FAIRCLOTH, 311 E. Park Ave, Tallahassee, Florida 32301.

6. The LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR hereby agrees to identify him or herself at all times as a representative of this SECTION and not as a representative of The Florida Bar when working on SECTION matters.

7. The SECTION and LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR further agree and consent to the disclosure of any information in this agreement by either party or by The Florida Bar as required by law, to include disclosure to the Florida Legislature of any amounts paid to the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR pursuant to this agreement.

8. This AGREEMENT is not assignable by either party and may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written/email notice or may be immediately terminated by The Florida Bar if it decides that the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR or a member of the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR's firm does not act within the best interest of The Florida Bar. In the event of such termination, the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR will be entitled to payment of outstanding fees. Monthly fees will be determined on a pro rata basis based on the number of days remaining in the applicable month.

9. Upon the expiration of this AGREEMENT, the LEGISLATIVE ADVISOR agrees not to undertake any responsibilities or engage in any activities which are contrary to an official legislative position of the SECTION for a period of twelve months. However, if the Florida Bar or SECTION terminates this AGREEMENT on or before January 1, 2020, pursuant to subsection 8., the provisions of this subsection are not enforceable.

10. Disclosure Requirements:


(a) Florida law requires lobbying firms to make certain public disclosures regarding their legislative and executive branch lobbying activity which includes registering to represent a lobbying client and reporting compensation related to all lobbying activity for each client on a quarterly basis with such compensation reports being subject to a random audit on an annual basis.

(b) The Florida House of Representatives also requires lobbying firms to publicly disclose each issue they are engaged to lobby on behalf of a lobbying client including specific

bill numbers. The Florida House of Representatives also requires lobbying firms representing public sector clients to post the lobbying contract on a public website.


(c) Florida lawyers who engage in lobbying activity for a client are bound by Rules Regulating the Florida Bar which provide that information relating to a client's representation are confidential unless certain limited exceptions apply. Some of the information required to be disclosed by Florida law and the Florida House of Representatives under subparagraphs (a) and (b) above, is considered confidential by the Florida Bar, as such, by entering into this Agreement, the SECTION consents to the disclosure of the required information.
